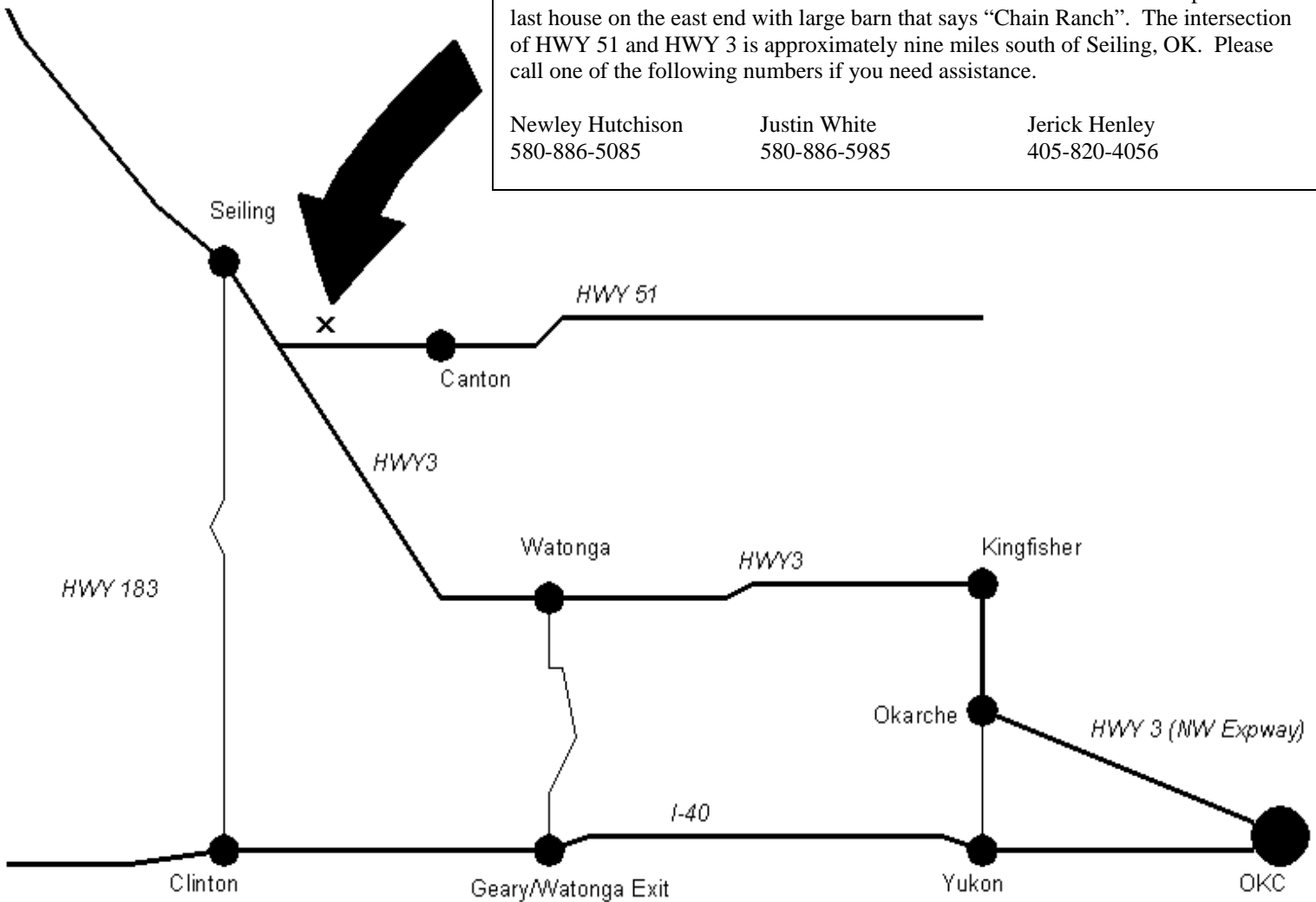
Chain Ranch

The ranch is located approximately 2 ½ miles east of the intersection of HWY 51 and HWY 3. There are four ranch houses on the north side HWY 51. Please pull to the last house on the east end with large barn that says “Chain Ranch”. The intersection of HWY 51 and HWY 3 is approximately nine miles south of Seiling, OK. Driving Distances and Estimated Drive Times:

Oklahoma City, OK to Chain Ranch
Tulsa, OK to Chain Ranch
Wichita, KS to Chain Ranch

100 miles, approximately 1 ½ hours
160 miles, approximately 2 ½ hours
200 miles, approximately 3 ½ hours

Required items to bring on a Chain Ranch Hog & Exotic Hunt

1. Weapon (.223 or larger caliber rifle, .30 caliber recommended, bow, muzzleloader, or pistol)
2. Ammunition or arrows
3. Sleeping Bag, pillow, sheet and/or blanket (our beds have fitted sheets, you bring your own bedroll)
4. Towel, toiletries, personal care items
5. Ice chest (one per anticipated harvested animal, ice available at the Ranch)
6. Appropriate clothing for current weather conditions (camouflage only necessary if you are bowhunting, gun hunters will hunt from enclosed blinds, hunter orange is not required)
7. Food and Beverages (a complete kitchen with all necessary cooking utensils is available in the lodge)
8. Charcoal and lighter fluid (grills are available at the lodge, but you will need to bring the charcoal and lighter fluid if you plan on grilling)
9. Flashlight and hunting/skinning knife

Frequently asked questions about a Chain Ranch Hog & Exotic Hunt

If I don't want to cook at the lodge, is there a restaurant close by?

Yes, eleven miles east of the lodge is the town of Canton, OK. There is a Mexican restaurant and a local diner. Seiling, OK also has a couple of restaurants.

Is there a place to clean the hog or will someone do it for me?

Yes, we have a complete cleaning facility for your use at no additional charge. This includes skinning poles, knives, saws, hot/cold water, ice machine, and walk-in cooler. If you want one of our guides to gut, skin, and quarter your animal there is a \$50 charge.

What are the lodges like?

The lodge is fully furnished with bunk beds (2-6 people per room, three rooms), television with satellite and VCR/DVD, microwave, refrigerator, coffeemaker, washer/dryer, stove/oven, cooking utensils, dishware, charcoal grill, central heat and air, and, yes, even hot water!

What happens if I miss or wound an animal?

Unfortunately a wounded animal is a dead animal. Very seldom do we lose a wounded animal, however, if that occurs, the odds of that animal living are very slim. Therefore, if blood is drawn, the animal is considered dead regardless of a successful recovery. Our guides monitor shots fired during the hunt and will ask for an accounting of those shots after each group is picked up from the field.

Can I bring my ATV?

No. There is no reason for you to bring your ATV. You will be transported to and from the hunting area.

What do we do when we're not hunting?

There are other activities available on the Chain Ranch. The rifle/pistol range is free for your use during your stay. For additional fees, fishing, upland bird preserve hunts, predator hunting, prairie dog shooting, and off-road adventures can be arranged.

What is the average shot distance?

The average shot distance for a rifle hunter is less than 100 yards. Be prepared to take shots anywhere from twenty-five yards to 125 yards. For the archer and pistol hunter, the average shot will be approximately twenty yards.

Explain to me a typical hunt.

You will arrive at the ranch between 12:00 pm and 2:00 pm. You'll settle into the lodge and head to the range for a quick site-in session. The guide will then take you to within 20 yards of your blind and drop you off. You will stay in your blind until the guide returns after sunset to pick you up. If you killed an animal it will be loaded on the truck and transported back to the lodge along with the other hunters. Do not field dress your hog in the field. You will have the opportunity to do that at the cleaning facility. If you choose not to, you can pay a guide \$50 to skin, gut, and quarter your animal. You will have the evening to yourself and will depart by 10:00 am the following morning, unless you have scheduled multiple day hunt.

Do I need a license or a tag?

Currently the State of Oklahoma does not require you to purchase a hunting license or tag for feral hogs or exotics.

What type of terrain are we hunting?

Our Reserve has been developed for hog/exotic hunting. The area was solid timber and rolling sand hills prior to our arrival. We have cut shooting lanes and food plots through out the area. The Free Range hunts take place in a variety of habitats, from river bottom swamps to blackjack oak covered sand hills.
